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# USER GUIDE

This document is a guide and codebook for the 2020 collaboration on data collection between the American National Election Studies (ANES) and General Social Survey (GSS), which resulted in a sample of GSS respondents answering questions from both studies and allows the two studies to be linked.

For the ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study, participants in the 2020 GSS also completed post-election interviews from the ANES 2020 Time Series study. A total of 1,164 GSS respondents completed post-election interviews for ANES, using self-administered web questionnaires.

## Sample Design and Respondent Recruitment

Respondents who completed the 2016-2020 General Social Survey Panel Study were invited to complete an ANES post-election interview. The GSS sample component eligible for the ANES consisted of 1,734 respondents to the GSS 2016-2020 panel survey, including a GSS interview in either 2016 and 2020, and who were U.S. citizens. They were subsequently invited by NORC at the University of Chicago for ANES to interview. Details regarding the GSS probability sample design, response rates, and interviewing methods are provided in the GSS documentation available from NORC. GSS cases were fielded for the ANES post-election survey (but not the ANES pre-election survey, due to the Covid-19 pandemic's effects on the GSS fielding schedule), resulting in 1,164 completed post-election ANES questionnaires. The number 1,164 includes both full interviews and sufficient partial interviews.

## Data Collection

*Field Dates.* The ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study collected data only during the post-election period of the 2020 ANES Time Series study. Election day was November 3, 2020. ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study respondents were interviewed alongside 2020 ANES Time Series study respondents during the post-election period, between November 8, 2020, and January 4, 2021.

*Questionnaire.* The questionnaire administered to GSS respondents was based on the ANES post-election questionnaire, but some additional questions were asked in a GSS-specific questionnaire module. Some important demographic information was not collected from GSS respondents in the ANES questionnaire because that information was already reported on the GSS questionnaire; these data are available from the GSS dataset.

*Locations.* ANES-GSS respondents were interviewed using a self-administered questionnaire on the Internet. The survey could be completed anywhere the respondent had access to the Internet on a computer or other device (including mobile devices).

*Languages.* Interviews were able to be conducted in English or Spanish.

## **Response Rates**

Information about the GSS response rate is available in the GSS documentation. The unweighted re-interview rate, or the unweighted response rate conditional on GSS participation, was  $1,164/1,734 = 67$  percent.

## **Available Files; Public and Restricted-Use Data**

The primary survey dataset for the ANES interviews of GSS respondents is the ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study public use dataset. It contains 1,164 cases (respondents).

The ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study public use dataset may be used in three ways:

1. as a stand-alone dataset,
2. joined to the GSS 2016-2020 Panel dataset (available from the GSS website), or
3. joined to the ANES 2020 Time Series dataset (available from the ANES website).

Three additional files are also available for use with the ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study:

- An ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study Bridging File that facilitates merging the ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study public use dataset to the ANES 2020 Time Series Study
- Redacted open-ended text responses
- A restricted-use dataset

*Joining to GSS.* The main intended purpose of the ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study is to enable merging the ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study dataset containing ANES questionnaire responses to the GSS 2016-2020 Panel dataset containing GSS questionnaire responses.

The two datasets can be merged by either:

- the GSS Case ID variable that is present on both files, YEARID, or
- the ANES Case ID variable that is present on both files, but is named V200001 in the ANES file and ANESID in the GSS file – one of the variables needs to be renamed to match the other prior to merging.

To combine the files, the type of merge is to “add variables” as the ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study cases are already present in the GSS 2016-2020 Panel dataset.

- The GSS 2016-2020 Panel dataset includes 5,215 cases (respondents).
- The ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study dataset includes 1,164 cases.
- Once the two datasets are merged by one of the Case ID variables, the resulting merged file should contain 5,215 cases. ANES data will be present for 1,164 of the GSS respondents, and ANES data will be missing for the 4,051 GSS respondents that did not participate in ANES.

*Joining to ANES.* The ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study dataset can also be merged with the ANES 2020 Time Series Study by using the ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study Bridging File. The ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study Bridging File includes records for respondents from both the ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study and the ANES 2020 Time Series Study, as well as weights for use in analyzing them together. The weights on the ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study Bridging File are necessary to correctly analyze the ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study cases and ANES 2020 Time Series Study cases together.

The three files can be merged using:

- the ANES Case ID variable that is present on both files, V200001.

To combine the files, the type of merge is to “add variables” to the ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study Bridging File as all of the cases from the two datasets are already present in the ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study Bridging File.

- The ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study Bridging File contains 9,444 records (respondents).
- The ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Study contains 1,164 ANES-GSS respondents.
- The ANES 2020 Time Series file contains an additional 8,280 ANES-only respondents.
- Once the two datasets are merged to the Bridging File by one of the Case ID variables, the resulting merged file should contain 9,444 cases. 1,164 of



the cases will be the ANES-GSS respondents, and the remaining 8,280 cases will be the ANES-only respondents. The weights for using the ANES-GSS and ANES-only respondents together will originate from the Bridging File.

*Restricted-use Dataset.* Some variables have been removed from the public-use dataset in order to protect respondent confidentiality. For these variables, the word “RESTRICTED” appears at the beginning of the variable label and responses have been set to the value “-3. Restricted.”

Examples of restricted variables include, but are not limited to: detailed geography, detailed religious denomination, birth date, detailed education, detailed business/industry, detailed occupation, detailed race/ethnicity, nationality, and detailed income.

Users can apply for access to some restricted variables through a Restricted Data Access agreement. Please see the Data Center on the ANES website for more information about the application process and variable availability. Some variables may also require approval from the GSS.

## Data Analysis, Weights, and Variance Estimation

The data should be analyzed using weights to accurately represent the population. Sampling errors should be calculated using methods that account for the complex sample design and the effects of weighting on variance. This section describes the variables to be used for these purposes.

### Weights

The Joint Study dataset includes one post-stratified weight variable. It is designed for analysis of the GSS cases alone:

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Separately, the GSS dataset available from the NORC website contains weights designed for analysis of the full GSS sample. To analyze the Joint Study cases as part of the GSS sample, the weights GSS provides may be used. However, to analyze the Joint Study cases alone, we recommend the weights provided on the Joint Study file.

The ANES bridging file (see above) contains two additional weights designed for analysis of the GSS cases in combination with the ANES cases. One is for the analysis of the entire combined ANES-GSS sample, and the other is for analysis of the combined sample excluding the subset of the sample that was designated for video interviews.

## Sampling errors and significance testing

Statistical procedures for complex sample designs should be used to obtain appropriate estimates of sampling errors and indications of statistical significance. Statistical software such as Stata, R with a survey analysis package, or SPSS with the Complex Samples package can perform a Taylor Series calculation of sampling errors when provided with the appropriate (pseudo-)strata and (pseudo-)cluster (also known as PSU or variance unit) variables. In Stata, the command to set up this type of analysis has the following form:

```
svyset [pweight=WEIGHT], strata(STRATA) psu(CLUSTER)
```

In the code example above, WEIGHT would be replaced with the correct weight for the type of analysis being performed (as indicated in the previous section on weighting). STRATA and CLUSTER would be replaced with the corresponding variance stratum and variance unit (PSU/cluster) for the selected weight.

On the Joint Study data file, the weight variable, PSU/cluster, and variance stratum are as follows.

For example, the code to set up Stata for an analysis of the ANES-GSS 2020 Joint Survey, which uses post-election weights only, is as follows:

## Weighting methodology

For GSS cases interviewed for ANES, weights were calculated as follows:

1. *Base weights* consisted of the final nonresponse-adjusted GSS survey weight, accounting for subsampling for inclusion in the ANES.
2. *Post-election raking* adjustments were made to make survey estimates match known population characteristics (for which the main source was the March 2020 Current Population Survey): age by gender, marital status by gender, race/ethnicity by educational attainment, race/ethnicity by Census region, nation of birth, home tenure by metropolitan status, and early voter status.
3. *Composite* adjustments were made for combinations of sample groups. These composites were raked using the dimensions listed above and also adjust for different design effects in different sample groups by weighting each sample group according to its effective (design-adjusted) sample size.

Complete documentation of the weight calculation methods will be included in the forthcoming methodology report for the ANES 2020 Time Series Study.

## Orientation to the Data and Documentation

## Dataset

The *ANES GSS 2020 Joint Study* is being made available in multiple formats: SPSS (.sav), Stata (.dta), Comma Separated Values (.csv), and a fixed-width raw data file that can be read into SAS, SPSS, and Stata using syntax statements that have been provided.

Variables are stored using formats optimized for their data type. Missing data are coded as negative numbers, for instance “-8. Don’t know”.

When downloading the dataset, users should also download and make use of the two following pieces of documentation:

## Questionnaire

The *ANES GSS 2020 Joint Study* participants answered the ANES 2020 Time Series post-election questionnaire. That document is available for download from the ANES 2020 Time Series Study page on the ANES website. It provides information about each of the questions that were asked in the survey. The questions in the Questionnaire are presented in the order they were asked. The Questionnaire includes the following information, where applicable, for each question: the section in which the question appears, question name, question wording, universe (where only a subset of respondents were to receive the question, which respondents those should be), response options, question logic, randomizations, display specifications, mode differences, and corresponding variables from the ANES 2020 Time Series Study Full Release dataset. Where applicable, such as for the post-election questionnaire, the Joint Study dataset has the same variables as the Time Series Study.

## User Guide and Codebook

The second piece of documentation is this User Guide and Codebook. The remainder of this file, following this narrative section, consists of the codebook.

Whereas the Questionnaire provides information about questions that were asked in the survey, the Codebook provides information about variables that appear in the dataset.

Questions and variables do not always have a one-to-one relationship. For instance, multiple questions may be combined into a single summary variable. Or multiple variables may be derived from a single question. Furthermore, not all variables have associated questions - for example, administrative variables.

The Codebook includes the following information, where applicable, for each variable: the variable name (all variable names start with a "V", and summary variables end with the suffix "x"), variable label (with "POST:" indicating that it is from the post-election study), question wording/variable meaning, response/code values and meanings, universe (where only a subset of respondents appear in a variable, which respondents those should be; note that universes are not included for most summary variables), associated survey question(s), information about whether randomization was used, interviewer instructions, and any other notes about the variable.
