THE CPS 1972 AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY (CPS #495401) WAS CONDUCTED BY THE CENTER FOR POLITICAL STUDIES OF THE INSTITUTE FOR SOCIAL RESEARCH, THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN. IT WAS THE TWELFTH IN A SERIES OF STUDIES OF NATIONAL ELECTIONS PRODUCED IN THE PAST BY THE POLITICAL BEHAVIOR PROGRAM OF THE SURVEY RESEARCH CENTER. THE STUDY WAS SUP-

PORTED BY GRANTS FROM THE NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION (GS-33956, GI-29904, GS-3322) AND THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE FOR MENTAL HEALTH (MH19516-08).

THERE WERE TWO FORMS OF THE QUESTIONNAIRE FOR BOTH WAVES: 1372 RESPONDENTS WERE ADMINISTERED THE FORM I PRE-ELECTION QUESTIONNAIRE AND 1333 RESPONDENTS WERE ADMINISTERED THE FORM II PRE-ELECTION QUESTIONNAIRE. FOR THE POST-ELECTION WAVE, 1176 RESPONDENTS RECEIVED FORM I AND 1109 FORM II.

THE PRIMARY OBJECTIVE OF THIS STUDY WAS ANALYSIS OF THE CURRENT ATTITUDES AND VOTING PATTERNS OF A CROSS-SECTION OF AMERICAN CITIZENS, PARTICULARLY IN COMPARISON WITH ATTITUDES AND VOTING PATTERNS FOUND IN PAST CROSS-SECTION STUDIES. IN ADDITION TO THE CONTINUING EMPHASIS ON THE ROLE OF THE POLITICAL PARTIES AND CANDIDATES, THE REACTIONS OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE TO CONTEMPORARY SOCIAL ISSUES WERE INVESTIGATED. AS A RESULT OF FINDINGS FROM PREVIOUS CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDIES, THE GENERAL THEMES OF TRUST IN GOVERNMENT, ALIENATION, AND EFFICACY WERE EMPHASIZED IN AN ATTEMPT TO DETERMINE THE CAUSES OF THE OBSERVED DECREASE IN PUBLIC SUPPORT OF THE POLITICAL SYSTEM. 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>> 1972 DESIGN OVERVIEW

IN ORDER TO MAXIMIZE THE NUMBER OF QUESTIONS WHICH COULD BE ADMINISTERED, TWO FORMS OF THE INTERVIEW WERE DEVELOPED, FORM I AND FORM II. ONE-HALF OF THE RESPONDENTS WERE ADMINISTERED FORM I OF THE PRE-ELECTION INTERVIEW SCHEDULE AND FORM I OF THE POST-ELECTION INTERVIEW SCHEDULE, WHILE THE OTHER HALF OF THE RESPONDENTS WERE ADMINISTERED FORM II IN BOTH THE PRE- AND POST-ELECTION WAVES. THE SAMPLE OF RESPONDENTS TO WHOM EACH FORM OF THE QUESTIONNAIRE WAS ADMINISTERED CONSTITUTES A CROSS-NATIONAL SAMPLE WHICH IS REPRESENTATIVE OF THE VOTING AGE POPULATION OF THE UNITED STATES RESIDING IN PRIVATE DWELLINGS. BECAUSE EACH IS REPRESENTATIVE THE TWO FORM SAMPLES MAY BE USED TOGETHER OR SEPARATELY FOR ANALYSIS PURPOSES. THE TWO FORMS HAVE APPROXIMATELY 80% OF THE SAME ITEMS AND 20% FORM UNIQUE QUESTIONS.

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>> 1972 CONTENT OF INTERVIEWS

THE CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY EXPLORED POLITICAL ATTITUDES AND BEHAVIOR IN THE 1972 ELECTION. THE

PARTY IDENTIFICATION OF THE RESPONDENTS, THEIR VOTING HISTORY, AND INFORMATION ABOUT FACETS OF EARLY POLITICAL SOCIALIZATION WERE OBTAINED, AS WELL AS THE RESPONDENTS' GENERAL EVALUATION OF THE MAJOR POLITICAL PARTIES. THE RESPONDENTS' SENSE OF POLITICAL EFFICACY AND CIVIC DUTY, THE DEGREE OF THEIR TRUST IN GOVERNMENT, AND THEIR EVALUATION OF GOVERNMENTAL RESPONSIVENESS WERE THE SUBJECTS OF QUESTIONS DESIGNED TO MEASURE DIMENSIONS OF THE RESPONDENTS' PERCEPTIONS OF THE RELATIONSHIP OF THE GOVERNMENT TO ITS CITIZENS.

OTHER ITEMS DEALT MORE SPECIFICALLY WITH THE 1972 CAMPAIGN AND ELECTION. THE RESPONDENTS' INTEREST IN THE CAMPAIGN AND CONCERN FOR THE OUTCOME OF THE ELECTION WERE ASCERTAINED, AND THEIR REPORTS OF THEIR VOTING BEHAVIOR WERE RECORDED. IN ADDITION, RESPONDENTS WERE ASKED TO REPORT THEIR FEELINGS ABOUT POTENTIAL PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATES ON A "FEELING THERMOMETER", THEIR SPECIFIC LIKES AND DISLIKES ABOUT THE PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATES, AND THEIR REACTIONS TO THE "EAGLETON AFFAIR". EACH RESPONDENT WAS PROBED ABOUT THE NATURE AND EXTENT OF HIS EXPOSURE TO THE MASS MEDIA. IN ADDITION, RESPONDENTS WERE ASKED QUESTIONS WHICH TESTED THEIR KNOWLEDGE OF POLITICAL INSTITUTIONS AND GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS.

THE 1972 AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY ALSO CONTAINED AN EXTENSIVE SERIES OF ITEMS WHICH WERE DESIGNED TO MEASURE THE RESPONDENTS' DEGREE OF SATISFACTION WITH THEIR LIVES AND ANTICIPATION OF CHANGE IN AREAS SUCH AS THEIR OCCUPATIONS, LEISURE-TIME ACTIVITIES, HOMES AND COMMUNITIES.

THE PERSONAL DATA SECTION CONTAINED A WIDE VARIETY OF INFORMATION ABOUT THE RESPONDENTS, SUCH AS EDUCATION, OCCUPATION, AGE, SEX, MARITAL STATUS, SOCIOECONOMIC STATUS, INCOME LEVEL, RELIGION, AND UNION AND ORGANIZATIONAL MEMBERSHIPS.

FOR A MORE DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF THE SUBJECT MATTER OF THE QUESTIONS ASKED OF RESPONDENTS IN THIS STUDY, THE USER IS REFERRED TO THE CHART WHICH FOLLOWS, AND TO THE TABLE OF CONTENTS.

AS IN PAST ELECTION STUDIES, THE CPS 1972 AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY FOCUSED ON VOTING BEHAVIOR--HOW THE CANDIDATES, PARTIES AND ISSUES AFFECTED THE POLITICAL BEHAVIOR OF THE RESPONDENT. HOWEVER, IT WAS DECIDED TO BROADEN THE PLANNING OF THE 1972 ELECTION STUDY TO INCLUDE MUCH MORE THAN POLITICAL BEHAVIOR. THROUGH A SERIES OF CONFERENCES, A GROUP OF SEVERAL POLITICAL SCIENTISTS FROM AROUND THE COUNTRY EMERGED AS POTENTIAL MAJOR PARTICIPANTS IN THE STUDY, ALONG WITH THOSE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN. THESE INVESTIGATORS SHARED A STRONG INTEREST IN A THEME THAT HAS BEGUN TO GROW IN IMPORTANCE IN AMERICAN VOTING RESEARCH--"SYSTEM SUPPORT". THAT IS, HOW, WHY AND INDEED WHETHER PEOPLE SUPPORT THE GOVERNMENTAL SYSTEM OF THE UNITED STATES.

AN AMBITIOUS PROPOSAL WAS SUBMITTED TO THE BEST POTENTIAL SOURCE OF FUNDING, THE NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION. ALTHOUGH IT WAS ACCEPTED, IT WAS NOT SUPPORTED

AT THE LEVEL HOPED FOR. TO SUPPLEMENT THE INITIAL NSF GRANT THE STUDY STAFF INVITED THE PARTICIPATION OF SEVERAL ISR COLLEAGUES IN CLOSELY-RELATED DISCIPLINES--PARTICULARLY ECONOMIC BEHAVIOR AND SOCIAL PSYCHOLOGY. THEIR FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTIONS MADE IT POSSIBLE FOR A FULL STUDY TO BE PERFORMED, BUT AT THE SAME TIME LEFT A VERY DIFFICULT CHOICE TO THE STUDY STAFF. THE INTERVIEW LENGTH COULD BE HELD DOWN TO THE NORMAL HOUR OR SO, LEAVING THE CENTER FOR POLITICAL STUDIES WITH A VERY SMALL BODY OF TRADITIONAL POLITICAL INFORMATION IN THE QUESTIONNAIRE OR THE INTERVIEWS COULD BE ALLOWED TO RUN LONGER. THE DECISION WAS MADE BY THE STUDY STAFF TO INCREASE INTERVIEW LENGTH IN ORDER TO RETAIN AN AMOUNT OF POLITICAL INFORMATION COMPARABLE WITH THAT OF PREVIOUS ELECTION STUDIES.

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>> 1972 SAMPLING INFORMATION

INDIVIDUALS INTERVIEWED IN THE CPS 1972 AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY WERE A REPRESENTATIVE CROSS-SECTION OF PERSONS 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER AS OF ELECTION DAY, NOVEMBER 7, 1972, WHO WERE U.S. CITIZENS AND WERE LIVING IN PRIVATE HOUSEHOLDS IN THE COTERMINOUS UNITED STATES. THE TWELVE LARGEST METROPOLITAN AREAS OF THE UNITED STATES WERE DRAWN WITH CERTAINTY. THE REST OF THE COUNTRY WAS FORMED INTO 62 STRATA, EACH OF WHICH CONTAINED TWO OR MORE PRIMARY SAMPLING UNITS. FROM EACH STRATUM A PRIMARY SAMPLING UNIT (CONSISTING OF A COUNTY OR A GROUP OF COUNTIES) WAS DRAWN WITH PROBABILITY PROPORTIONAL TO ITS 1970 POPULATION. SEVENTY-FOUR PSU'S WERE DRAWN AND THE SELECTION PROCEDURE WITHIN THESE PSU'S YIELDED A SAMPLE OF PRIVATE HOUSEHOLDS. RESPONDENTS WERE SELECTED FROM HOUSEHOLDS BY AN OBJECTIVE SELECTION PROCEDURE WHICH ALLOWED NO SUBSTITUTIONS. INDIVIDUALS LIVING IN GROUP QUARTERS (E.G., BARRACKS, DORMITORIES, FRATERNITIES, ROOMING HOUSES, ETC.), INSTITUTIONAL POPULATIONS (E.G., HOSPITALS, CONVENTS, HOMES FOR THE AGED, ETC.) AND PERSONS WITH NO PLACE OF RESIDENCE WERE NOT INCLUDED IN THE SAMPLE.

THE STUDY IS REPRESENTATIVE OF THE FOUR MAJOR REGIONS (NORTHEAST, NORTH CENTRAL, SOUTH AND WEST) OF THE UNITED STATES AS WELL AS OF THE ENTIRE UNITED STATES. THE SAMPLE, HOWEVER, IS NOT REPRESENTATIVE AT THE STATE LEVEL. AS IN 1968, THE PRE-ELECTION INTERVIEWS WERE CONDUCTED

IN TWO BLOCKS OF TIME SO THAT CHANGES IN VOTING INTENTIONS AND SHIFTS IN ATTITUDES DURING THE ELECTION CAMPAIGN PERIOD COULD BE ANALYZED. THE PRE-ELECTION INTERVIEWS OF THE FIRST BLOCK, OR FIRST HALF-SAMPLE, WERE CONDUCTED FROM SEPTEMBER 5, 1972 TO OCTOBER 15, 1972. INTERVIEWS FOR THE SECOND HALF-SAMPLE OF RESPONDENTS WERE CONDUCTED BETWEEN OCTOBER 16, 1972 AND NOVEMBER 6, 1972. EACH OF THESE HALF-SAMPLES IS A NATIONAL CROSS-SECTION.

THE OVERALL RESPONSE RATE FOR THE PRE-ELECTION SURVEY WAS 75.1%. RESPONDENTS INTERVIEWED IN THE PRE-ELECTION WAVE WERE REINTERVIEWED IN THE POST-ELECTION WAVE BETWEEN NOVEMBER 8, 1972 AND FEBRUARY 13, 1973. POST-ELECTION INTERVIEWS WERE CONDUCTED WITH 2181 OF THE 2705 RESPONDENTS: A REINTERVIEW RATE OF 80.9%. TO HELP COMPENSATE FOR A POST-ELECTION RESPONSE RATE THAT WAS SOMEWHAT LOW, 3 PAGE MAIL QUESTIONNAIRES (FORMS III AND IV), INQUIRING ABOUT THE 1972 VOTE AS WELL AS ABOUT OTHER POLITICAL ISSUES, WERE SENT TO POST-ELECTION NON-INTERVIEWEES FOR WHOM A MAILING ADDRESS WAS AVAILABLE. THIS MAILING BROUGHT RESPONSES FROM 94 OF THE ORIGINAL NON-INTERVIEWEES, THEREBY INCREASING THE OVERALL POST-ELECTION RESPONSE RATE TO 84.4%.

UNLIKE THE 1964, 1968 AND 1970 ELECTION STUDIES, THE 1972 STUDY DOES NOT CONTAIN A SUPPLEMENT OF BLACK RESPONDENTS BECAUSE OF THE LARGE SAMPLE, WHICH INCLUDED 267 BLACK RESPONDENTS.

THE INTERVIEWS WERE CODED BY THE CODING SECTION OF THE SURVEY RESEARCH CENTER, THE INSTITUTE FOR SOCIAL RESEARCH. CODING WAS SUPERVISED BY CPS STUDY DIRECTOR ARTHUR H. MILLER AND ASSISTANT STUDY DIRECTORS THAD A. BROWN AND ALDEN S. RAINE, WHO ALSO ASSISTED WITH OTHER MAJOR PHASES OF THE STUDY. THE USUAL PRACTICE OF CHECK CODING ONE OUT OF EVERY TEN INTERVIEWS WAS FOLLOWED. THIS RESULTED IN THE CALCULATION OF AN AVERAGE CODING ERROR OF .64 ERRORS PER INTERVIEW FOR THE PRE-ELECTION SURVEY, AND .46 FOR THE POST-ELECTION.

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>> 1974 STUDY DESCRIPTION

THE CPS 1974 AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY (CPS # 495441) WAS CONDUCTED BY THE CENTER FOR POLITICAL STUDIES OF THE INSTITUTE FOR SOCIAL RESEARCH, THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN UNDER THE DIRECTION OF WARREN MILLER, ARTHUR MILLER AND GERALD KLINE. IT WAS THE THIRTEENTH IN A SERIES OF STUDIES OF NATIONAL ELECTIONS PRODUCED BY THE POLITICAL BEHAVIOR PROGRAM OF THE SURVEY RESEARCH CENTER AND THE CENTER FOR POLITICAL STUDIES. THE STUDY WAS SUPPORTED BY GRANTS FROM THE NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION (SOC 75-02704), THE JOHN AND MARY R. MARKLE FOUNDATION AND THE CARNEGIE CORPORATION.

THE BASIC DESIGN OF THE 1974 STUDY INCLUDES A SUBSET OF THE RESPONDENTS WHO HAD PREVIOUSLY BEEN INTERVIEWED IN THE 1972 POST-ELECTION SURVEY. THIS SET OF PANEL RESPONDENTS WAS THEN AUGMENTED WITH A SET OF NEW INTERVIEWS SELECTED SO AS TO PROVIDE A REPRESENTATIVE CROSS-SECTION OF U.S. CITIZENS WHEN COMBINED WITH THE NON-MOVING PANEL RESPONDENTS. NEW RESPONDENTS WERE NOT, HOWEVER, SELECTED AT THE SAME SAMPLING RATE AS 1972 RESPONDENTS; THUS WEIGHTING IS NECESSARY TO FORM A REPRESENTATIVE CROSS-SECTION FROM THE TWO TYPES OF RESPONDENT. THE 1974 AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY INCLUDES ONLY THE CROSS-SECTION SAMPLES, THAT IS, NON-MOVING PANEL RESPONDENTS AND THE RESPONDENTS WHO WERE

ADDED IN 1974. THE STUDY INCLUDES 1575 RESPONDENTS, 14 CARDS OF DATA PER RESPONDENT, AND 564 VARIABLES. RESPONDENTS WERE INTERVIEWED FROM NOVEMBER 5, 1974 THROUGH JANUARY 31, 1975, FOLLOWING THE CONGRESSIONAL ELECTIONS.

THE CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY EXPLORED POLITICAL ATTITUDES AND BEHAVIOR IN THE CONTEXT OF THE WATERGATE EVENTS AND THE 1974 CONGRESSIONAL ELECTIONS. THE PARTY IDENTIFICATION OF THE RESPONDENTS, THEIR VOTING HISTORY, AND INFORMATION ABOUT FACETS OF EARLY POLITICAL SOCIALIZATION WERE OBTAINED. THE RESPONDENTS' SENSE OF POLITICAL EFFICACY AND CIVIC DUTY, THE DEGREE OF THEIR TRUST IN GOVERNMENT, AND THEIR EVALUATIONS OF GOVERNMENTAL RESPONSIVENESS WERE THE SUBJECTS OF QUESTIONS DESIGNED TO MEASURE DIMENSIONS OF THE RESPONDENTS' PERCEPTIONS OF THE RELATIONSHIP OF THE GOVERNMENT TO ITS CITIZENS.

CONSIDERABLE ATTENTION WAS ALSO FOCUSED ON WATERGATE EVENTS. FEELING THERMOMETERS WERE USED TO TAP REACTIONS TO THE PRINCIPAL FIGURES IN THESE EVENTS. ANOTHER SERIES OF QUESTIONS TAPPED ATTITUDES TOWARDS THE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE'S IMPEACHMENT HEARINGS AND THE DECISION TO IMPEACH, NIXON'S RESIGNATION, AND FORD'S PARDON OF NIXON. RESPONDENTS WERE ALSO ASKED TO EVALUATE MEDIA OBJECTIVITY IN COVERAGE OF THE INVOLVEMENT OF THE NIXON ADMINISTRATION IN THE WATERGATE AFFAIR.

THE STUDY CONTAINED EXTENSIVE INQUIRIES INTO THE RESPONDENTS' MEDIA-RELATED ATTITUDES AND BEHAVIOR. AN INITIAL SERIES OF QUESTIONS DEALT WITH THE GENERAL EXTENT OF MASS MEDIA USAGE, AND ALSO MEDIA USAGE SPECIFICALLY AS A NEWS SOURCE. FURTHER QUESTIONS PROBED MORE DEEPLY INTO TELEVISION AND NEWSPAPERS AS A SOURCE OF CAMPAIGN INFORMATION. ADDITIONAL QUESTIONS CONCERNED THE RESPONDENT'S MOTIVATIONS FOR FOLLOWING THE CAMPAIGN IN THE MASS MEDIA.

OTHER ITEMS DEALT MORE SPECIFICALLY WITH THE 1974 CAMPAIGN AND ELECTION. THE RESPONDENTS' INTEREST IN THE CAMPAIGN AND CONCERN FOR THE OUTCOME OF THE ELECTION WERE ASCERTAINED, AND THEIR REPORTS OF THEIR 1974 VOTING BEHAVIOR WERE RECORDED. IN ADDITION, RESPONDENTS WERE ASKED TO REPORT THEIR FEELINGS ABOUT POTENTIAL PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATES ON A FEELING THERMOMETER, AND TO GIVE THEIR SPECIFIC LIKES AND DISLIKES ABOUT THE SENATORIAL CANDIDATES.

AS IN THE PAST, THE QUESTIONNAIRE INCLUDED AN INQUIRY INTO THE MAJOR PROBLEMS FACING THE COUNTRY. A FEELING THERMOMETER SERIES WAS USED TO MEASURE RESPONDENT PERCEPTIONS OF GROUP INFLUENCES IN AMERICAN LIFE AND POLITICS. ANOTHER SERIES OF SCALES MEASURED THE RESPONDENTS' POSITION AND THE POSITION OF THE POLITICAL PARTIES AND CERTAIN POLITICAL LEADERS WITH REGARD TO POLITICAL ISSUES SUCH AS BUSING, WOMEN'S LIBERATION, URBAN UNREST, RIGHTS OF ACCUSED PERSONS, AID TO MINORITIES AND THE IMPORTANCE OF GOVERNMENT GUARANTEES OF LIVING STANDARDS. FURTHER, RESPONDENTS WERE ASKED TO EVALUATE THEMSELVES AND POLITICAL LEADERS AND PARTIES ON A LIBERAL-CONSERVATIVE SCALE.

SEVERAL SERIES OF QUESTIONS DEALT WITH NON-POLITICAL ISSUES. RESPONDENTS WERE QUESTIONED ABOUT THEIR PERCEPTION

OF THEIR FINANCIAL CONDITION, AND ABOUT BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC CONDITIONS IN THE NATION AS A WHOLE. RESPONDENTS WERE ASKED TO EVALUATE THE QUALITY OF THEIR OWN LIFE IN A SERIES OF QUESTIONS DESIGNED TO MEASURE PERSONAL ESTEEM, TRUST AND QUALITY OF LIFE.

THE PERSONAL DATA SECTION CONTAINED A WIDE VARIETY OF INFORMATION ABOUT THE RESPONDENTS AND THEIR FAMILIES. INFORMATION WAS SOUGHT ON EDUCATION, OCCUPATION, UNION MEMBERSHIP(S), AGE, SEX, MARITAL STATUS AND FAMILY COMPOSITION, SOCIOECONOMIC STATUS, ETHNIC BACKGROUND, INCOME LEVEL AND RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION.

THE SAMPLE FOR THE 1974 CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY WAS A COMBINATION OF TWO SAMPLES, EACH DERIVED FROM THE 1972 CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY SAMPLE. THE 1972 SAMPLE WAS SUPPLEMENTED TO INCLUDE REPRESENTATIONS OF HOUSING UNITS AND CITIZENS ADDED TO THE STUDY UNIVERSE AFTER THE FALL OF 1972. THE SAMPLING OF HOUSING UNITS UTILIZED THE SURVEY RESEARCH CENTER'S MASTER FRAME OF COTERMINOUS UNITED STATES HOUSING UNITS EXCLUSIVE OF THOSE ON MILITARY BASES. <SEE KISH, LESLIE AND HESS, IRENE, "THE SURVEY RESEARCH CENTER'S NATIONAL SAMPLE OF DWELLINGS," ISR NUMBER 2315, ANN ARBOR, MICHIGAN: INSTITUTE FOR SOCIAL RESEARCH, THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN>

THE 1972 SAMPLE OF HOUSING UNITS, SELECTED AT THE OVERALL RATE OF ABOUT 1/17,000, WAS DESIGNED TO YIELD APPROXIMATELY 2,600 INTERVIEWS, ONE PER HOUSING UNIT, WITH UNITED STATES CITIZENS 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER ON OR BEFORE NOVEMBER 7, 1972. ALTHOUGH HOUSING UNITS HAD EQUAL SELECTION PROBABIL-

ITIES, RESPONDENTS HAD DISPROPORTIONATE SELECTION RATES BECAUSE THE NUMBER OF ELIGIBLE PERSONS VARIES AMONG HOUSING UNITS. THOSE PERSONS INTERVIEWED PRIOR TO THE 1972 ELECTION WERE CONTACTED AFTER NOVEMBER 7 FOR A POST-ELECTION INTERVIEW. THOSE PERSONS GRANTING TWO INTERVIEWS IN 1972 (PRE- AND POST-ELECTION) COMPRISE THE PANEL FOR THE 1974 STUDY.

#### THE 1974 PANEL STUDY

THE PANEL STUDY IS SIMPLE IN CONCEPT. AFTER THE 1974 ELECTION, ATTEMPTS TO CONTACT THE 2191 RESPONDENTS WHO GRANTED BOTH A PRE- AND POST-ELECTION INTERVIEW IN 1972 WERE MADE. IF A PANEL MEMBER HAD MOVED FROM HIS OR HER 1972 RESIDENCE, EVERY REASONABLE EFFORT WAS MADE TO LOCATE THAT PERSON AND INTERVIEW HER OR HIM AT THE 1974 RESIDENCE. THUS, APPROXIMATELY 1625 INTERVIEWS WERE OBTAINED WITH PANEL MEMBERS.

#### THE 1974 CROSS-SECTION STUDY

##### THE SAMPLE OF HOUSING UNITS

INSTEAD OF SELECTING A NEW SAMPLE OF HOUSING UNITS (HU'S), A CURRENT CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE OF HU'S WAS CONSTRUCTED AT THE OVER-ALL RATE OF APPROXIMATELY 1/51,000 BY SUB-SAMPLING THE 1972 SAMPLE HU'S AT THE RATE OF 1/3 AND THEN ADDING TO THE 1972 SAMPLE A 1/51,000 SAMPLE OF HU'S THAT HAD ZERO CHANCE OF SELECTION IN 1972 FOR ONE OF THREE REASONS: (1) THEY WERE OVERLOOKED IN 1972 WHEN THE LISTS WERE PREPARED; (2) THEY RESULTED FROM CONVERSIONS AFTER 1972; (3) THEY WERE NEWLY CONSTRUCTED AFTER 1972.

THE SUBSAMPLING OF 1972 SAMPLE HU'S WAS ACCOMPLISHED IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER:

1. ONE-THIRD OF THE PANEL HU'S WERE DESIGNATED FOR THE CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE, THE SAMPLE SELECTION CUTTING ACROSS ALL REGIONS, ALL PRIMARY AREAS, ALL PLACES AND ALL SEGMENTS THAT HAD ONE OR MORE PANEL HU'S. IF MORE THAN ONE HU WAS FOUND TO EXIST AT A DESIGNATED PANEL ADDRESS, THOSE ADDITIONAL HU'S WERE ADDED TO THE 1974 SAMPLE.
2. ONE-THIRD OF THE 1972 VACANT HU'S, NON-RESPONSES AND PRE-ELECTION ONLY RESPONSES WERE CHOSEN FOR THE CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE IN A MANNER SIMILAR TO THE SUBSAMPLING OF PANEL HU'S. IF MORE THAN ONE HU WAS FOUND AT A 1972 ADDRESS, THOSE ADDITIONAL HU'S WERE ADDED TO THE 1974 SAMPLE.
3. INTERVIEWERS WERE INSTRUCTED TO UPDATE THE HU LISTINGS FOR EACH SAMPLE SEGMENT; THEN INSTRUCTIONS IN THE FORM OF LISTING SHEET LINE NUMBERS WERE PROVIDED, SO ONE-THIRD OF THE HU'S IN PREVIOUSLY UNLISTED RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS WERE ADDED TO THE SAMPLE.

## THE SAMPLE OF ELIGIBLE PERSONS

FOR THE 1974 CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY, HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS WHO WERE UNITED STATES CITIZENS 16 YEARS OF AGE OR OVER WERE ELIGIBLE TO BE CHOSEN AS RESPONDENTS. SINCE ANY ELIGIBLE PERSON WHO WAS UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE ON NOVEMBER 7, 1972 HAD ZERO CHANCE OF SELECTION IN 1972, A PROCEDURE TO GIVE SUCH PERSONS A NON-ZERO CHANCE OF SELECTION IN 1974 WAS DEvised. THE SELECTION OF RESPONDENTS PROCEEDED AS FOLLOWS:

1. ONE-THIRD SELECTION OF 1972 NONPANEL HU'S:  
THESE ARE THE 1972 HU'S THAT WERE VACANT, PRODUCED NONRESPONSES OR ONLY A PRE-ELECTION RESPONSE. AT EACH OF THESE HU'S, HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS 16 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER WERE LISTED AND AN INTERVIEW ATTEMPTED WITH AN OBJECTIVELY SELECTED RESPONDENT. <SEE KISH, LESLIE, "A PROCEDURE FOR OBJECTIVE RESPONDENT SELECTION WITHIN THE HOUSEHOLD," JOURNAL OF THE AMERICAN STATISTICAL ASSOCIATION, 44 (SEPTEMBER, 1949), PP. 380-387.>
2. 1974 SAMPLE HU'S NON-EXISTENT IN 1972:  
AT EACH OF THESE HU'S HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS 16 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER WERE LISTED AND AN INTERVIEW ATTEMPTED WITH AN OBJECTIVELY SELECTED RESPONDENT.
3. ONE-THIRD SAMPLE OF 1972 PANEL HU'S:  
THERE WERE THREE SITUATIONS:
  - A) THE PANEL MEMBER NO LONGER LIVED AT THE HU. IN THIS CASE, ALL HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS 16 YEARS AND OVER WERE LISTED AND AN INTERVIEW ATTEMPTED WITH ONE OBJECTIVELY SELECTED RESPONDENT.
  - B) THE PANEL MEMBER STILL LIVED AT THE 1972 HU AND NO NEW MEMBERS HAD BEEN ADDED TO THE HOUSEHOLD. BY "NEW" MEMBERS WE MEAN ANYONE WHO HAD ZERO CHANCE OF SELECTION FOR THE 1972 STUDY. THE CPS 1974 AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY SAMPLE CONSISTED OF PANEL AND CROSS-SECTION COMPONENTS. THE RE-CONTACTED RESPONDENTS FORMING THE PANEL WERE FIRST INTERVIEWED IN THE PRE- AND POST-ELECTION PHASES OF THE 1972 CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY. OF THESE PANEL RESPONDENTS 1101 WERE FOUND TO REMAIN AT THEIR 1972 ADDRESSES AND WERE INCORPORATED INTO THE 1974 CROSS SECTION SAMPLE. THESE RESPONDENTS WERE GIVEN A WEIGHT OF 1. TO FORM A REPRESENTATIVE CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE OF ADULTS 16 YEARS AND OVER, 474 NON-PANEL RESPONDENTS WERE SELECTED BY SUB-SAMPLING THE 1972 SAMPLE OF HOUSING UNITS. SINCE THE CROSS-SECTION (NON-PANEL) RESPONDENTS WERE SELECTED WITH A ONE-THIRD FRACTION OUT OF THE AVAILABLE ADDRESSES, THEY WERE GIVEN A WEIGHT OF 3.

THERE IS ONE WEIGHT VARIABLE IN THE CPS 1974 AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY. (SEE V742003; THIS SHOULD BE USED IN CONJUNCTION WITH DATA ANALYSIS PROGRAMS.)

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>> 1974 PROCESSING INFORMATION

THIS STUDY WAS PROCESSED ACCORDING TO THE STANDARD ICPSR PROCEDURES. THE DATA WERE CHECKED FOR INCONSISTENT CODES, ILLEGAL CODES, AND BLANKS WHICH, WHENEVER FOUND, WERE CORRECTED BY REFERRING TO THE ORIGINAL INTERVIEW SCHEDULES. STATEMENTS BRACKETED IN "<" AND ">" SIGNS IN THE BODY OF THE CODEBOOK AND THE FOOTNOTES WERE ADDED BY THE PROCESSORS FOR EXPLANATORY PURPOSES. THE PROCESSING OF THE STUDY WAS PLANNED AND EXECUTED PRIMARILY BY MICHAEL NOLTE WITH THE COLLABORATION OF PETER JOFTIS AND MITCHELL COHEN.

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>> 1976 STUDY DESCRIPTION

THE CPS 1976 AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY WAS CONDUCTED BY THE CENTER FOR POLITICAL STUDIES OF THE INSTITUTE FOR SOCIAL RESEARCH, THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN UNDER THE DIRECTION OF WARREN E. MILLER AND ARTHUR H. MILLER. IT WAS THE FOURTEENTH IN A SERIES OF STUDIES OF NATIONAL ELECTIONS PRODUCED BY THE POLITICAL BEHAVIOR PROGRAM OF THE SURVEY RESEARCH CENTER AND THE CENTER FOR POLITICAL STUDIES. THE STUDY WAS SUPPORTED BY A GRANT FROM THE NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION (SOC 76-13562).

RESPONDENTS WERE INTERVIEWED BOTH BEFORE AND AFTER THE 1976 ELECTION. THE PRE-ELECTION QUESTIONNAIRE WAS ADMINISTERED TO 2,248 RESPONDENTS AND THE POST-ELECTION QUESTIONNAIRE WAS ADMINISTERED TO 1,909 RESPONDENTS. THE DESIGN OF THE 1976 STUDY INCLUDES A SUBSET OF RESPONDENTS WHO HAD PREVIOUSLY BEEN INTERVIEWED IN BOTH THE 1972 POST-ELECTION SURVEY AND THE 1974 ELECTION STUDY. THIS SET OF PANEL RESPONDENTS WAS THEN AUGMENTED WITH A SET OF NEW INTERVIEWS SELECTED TO PROVIDE A REPRESENTATIVE CROSS-SECTION OF U.S. CITIZENS WHEN COMBINED WITH THE NON-MOVING PANEL RESPONDENTS. NEW RESPONDENTS WERE NOT, HOWEVER, SELECTED AT THE SAME SAMPLING RATE AS PANEL RESPONDENTS; THUS WEIGHTING WAS NECESSARY TO FORM A REPRESENTATIVE CROSS-SECTION FROM THE TWO TYPES OF RESPONDENTS.

THE PRIMARY OBJECTIVE OF THIS STUDY WAS ANALYSIS OF CURRENT ATTITUDES AND VOTING PATTERNS OF A CROSS-SECTION OF AMERICAN CITIZENS, PARTICULARLY IN COMPARISON WITH ATTITUDES AND VOTING PATTERNS FOUND IN PREVIOUS CROSS-SECTION STUDIES. AS IN PAST ELECTION STUDIES, EMPHASIS WAS PLACED ON HOW THE CANDIDATES, PARTIES, AND ISSUES AFFECTED THE POLITICAL BEHAVIOR OF RESPONDENTS. IN ADDITION, THE IMPACT OF THE MASS MEDIA, PARTICULARLY THE 1976 PRESIDENTIAL DEBATES, AND THE GENERAL THEMES OF ALIENATION AND TRUST IN GOVERNMENT WERE INVESTIGATED.

## CONTENT OF INTERVIEWS

THE CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY EXPLORED POLITICAL ATTITUDES AND BEHAVIOR IN THE CONTEXT OF THE 1976 CAMPAIGN AND ELECTION. ITEMS DEALING SPECIFICALLY WITH THE CAMPAIGN AND ELECTION ELICITED RESPONDENTS' INTEREST IN THE CAMPAIGN, CONCERN FOR THE OUTCOME OF THE ELECTION, AND EVALUATION OF THE CANDIDATES, AS WELL AS THEIR VOTING BEHAVIOR. THE PARTY IDENTIFICATION OF THE RESPONDENTS, THEIR VOTING HISTORY, INFORMATION ABOUT FACETS OF EARLY POLITICAL SOCIALIZATION, AND THE RESPONDENTS' EVALUATION OF THE POLITICAL PARTIES WERE ALSO OBTAINED.

SIMILAR TO PAST STUDIES, THE QUESTIONNAIRE INCLUDED AN IDENTIFICATION OF THE MAJOR PROBLEMS THOUGHT TO BE FACING THE COUNTRY. A SERIES OF QUESTIONS DEALT WITH THE RESPONDENTS' SENSE OF POLITICAL EFFICACY AND CIVIC DUTY, THE DEGREE OF THEIR TRUST IN GOVERNMENT, AND THEIR EVALUATIONS OF GOVERNMENT RESPONSIVENESS. RACE RELATIONS AND THE CONTROVERSIAL ISSUE OF BUSING WERE INVESTIGATED WITH BOTH OPEN-ENDED AND STRUCTURED QUESTIONS. RESPONDENTS WERE ALSO ASKED TO INDICATE THEIR FEELINGS TOWARD POTENTIAL CANDIDATES AND GROUP INFLUENCES IN AMERICAN LIFE AND POLITICS ON A "FEELING THERMOMETER." ANOTHER SERIES OF ISSUE SCALES MEASURED THE RESPONDENTS' POSITION AND THEIR PERCEPTIONS OF THE POSITIONS OF THE POLITICAL PARTIES, POSITIONS OF CERTAIN POLITICAL LEADERS AND VARIOUS SOCIAL GROUPS WITH REGARD TO POLITICAL ISSUES SUCH AS BUSING, WOMEN'S LIBERATION, MARIJUANA USE, NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE, THE RIGHTS OF ACCUSED PERSONS, AID TO MINORITIES, AND THE IMPORTANCE OF GOVERNMENT GUARANTEES OF LIVING STANDARDS. RESPONDENTS WERE FURTHER ASKED TO EVALUATE THEMSELVES, THE PARTIES, AND THE CANDIDATES ON A LIBERAL-CONSERVATIVE SCALE.

THE STUDY ALSO CONTAINED SPECIFIC INQUIRIES INTO THE IMPACT OF THE MASS MEDIA. A SERIES OF QUESTIONS EXAMINED MEDIA USAGE IN GENERAL, AS WELL AS HOW THE MEDIA WERE USED AS A SOURCE OF CAMPAIGN INFORMATION. IN ADDITION, A SERIES OF QUESTIONS WAS DESIGNED TO MEASURE THE IMPACT OF THE 1976 PRESIDENTIAL DEBATES ON POLITICAL LEARNING AND INFORMATION HOLDING.

OTHER SERIES OF QUESTIONS DEALT WITH NON-POLITICAL ISSUES. RESPONDENTS WERE QUESTIONED ABOUT PERCEPTIONS OF THEIR OWN FINANCIAL CONDITION AS WELL AS BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC CONDITIONS IN THE NATION AS A WHOLE. RESPONDENTS WERE QUESTIONED ABOUT PERCEPTIONS OF THEIR OWN LIFE IN A SERIES OF QUESTIONS DESIGNED TO MEASURE PERSONAL ESTEEM, TRUST AND QUALITY OF LIFE.

THE PERSONAL DATA SECTION CONTAINED A WIDE VARIETY OF INFORMATION ABOUT THE RESPONDENTS AND THEIR FAMILIES. INFORMATION WAS SOUGHT ON EDUCATION, OCCUPATION, UNION MEMBERSHIP(S), AGE, SEX, MARITAL STATUS AND FAMILY COMPOSITION, SOCIOECONOMIC STATUS, ETHNIC BACKGROUND, INCOME LEVEL AND RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION.



□>> 1976 SAMPLING INFORMATION

THE SAMPLE FOR THE CENTER FOR POLITICAL STUDIES' 1976 AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY WAS A COMBINATION OF THREE OVERLAPPING SAMPLES, EACH ONE DERIVED FROM THE INITIAL CPS 1972 ELECTION STUDY SAMPLE FRAME. THE 1972 SAMPLE WAS SUPPLEMENTED TO ATTAIN REPRESENTATION OF ALL HOUSING UNITS (HU'S) AND CITIZENS ADDED TO THE STUDY UNIVERSE AFTER THE FALL OF 1972. THE SAMPLING OF HOUSEHOLD UNITS UTILIZED THE SURVEY RESEARCH CENTER'S MASTER FRAME OF COTERMINOUS UNITED STATES: HOUSING UNITS EXCLUSIVE OF INSTITUTIONAL POPULATIONS. A MORE DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF THIS SAMPLING PROCEDURE CAN BE FOUND IN LESLIE KISH AND IRENE HESS, "THE SURVEY RESEARCH CENTER'S NATIONAL SAMPLE OF DWELLINGS," (ISR #2315, ANN ARBOR, MICHIGAN: INSTITUTE FOR SOCIAL RESEARCH, THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN).

THE 1976 CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE DESIGN

THE 1976 ELECTION STUDY WAS DESIGNED TO PRODUCE BOTH A REPRESENTATIVE CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE OF UNITED STATES ADULT CITIZENS AND TO COMPLETE A THREE WAVE (1972-1974-1976) PANEL STUDY. THIS "DUAL" DESIGN FEATURE OF THE STUDY WAS MOST EFFICIENTLY SERVED BY CONSTRUCTING A CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE STARTED WITH THE 1972 SAMPLE FRAME. IT THEN COMBINED ALL HOUSING UNITS (HU'S) WHERE A NON-MOVING 1972 RESPONDENT WAS IN RESIDENCE WITH A TWO-THIRDS SUBSAMPLE OF THE HU'S THAT 1972 RESPONDENTS HAD VACATED AND A TWO-THIRDS SUBSAMPLE OF HU'S THAT HAD ZERO CHANCE OF SELECTION IN 1972 FOR ONE OF THE FOLLOWING REASONS: (1) THEY WERE OVERLOOKED PREVIOUSLY; (2) THEY RESULTED FROM CONVERSIONS OF VACANCIES AFTER 1972; OR, (3) THEY RESULTED FROM NEW CONSTRUCTION AFTER 1972. TWO-THIRDS WAS USED AS A SUBSAMPLING FRACTION FOR HU'S ADDED TO THE PANEL HU'S SIMPLY BECAUSE THE BUDGET DID NOT ALLOW US TO TAKE INTERVIEWS IN ALL THESE HOUSEHOLDS.

THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE 1976 CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE WAS ACCOMPLISHED IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER:

1. TREATMENT OF PANEL HOUSEHOLDS:
  - A. THE PANEL MEMBER STILL LIVED AT THE 1972 HU AND NO NEW MEMBERS HAD BEEN ADDED TO THE HOUSEHOLD: "NEW" MEMBERS MEANS ANYONE WHO HAD ZERO CHANCE OF SELECTION FOR THE 1972 STUDY. WHEN THE PANEL MEMBER WAS PRESENT AND THERE WERE NO NEW MEMBERS, THE PANEL MEMBER WAS ALSO THE CROSS-SECTION RESPONDENT.
  - B. THE PANEL MEMBER WAS STILL LIVING AT THE SAMPLE HU, BUT ONE OR MORE NEW MEMBERS WERE PRESENT IN THE HOUSEHOLD: INTERVIEWERS WERE INSTRUCTED TO LIST ALL ELIGIBLE HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS AND TO CHOOSE ONE OBJECTIVELY. IF THE CHOSEN PERSON WAS NOT AN ELIGIBLE HOUSEHOLD MEMBER IN 1972, A CROSS-SECTION INTERVIEW WAS ATTEMPTED WITH THE OBJECTIVELY SELECTED CHOSEN PERSON; OTHERWISE THE PANEL MEMBER WAS DESIGNATED RESPONDENT FOR THE CROSS-SECTION STUDY AS WELL AS FOR THE PANEL.

2. TREATMENT OF NON-PANEL HOUSEHOLDS: TWO-THIRDS OF THE 1972 VACANT HU'S, AND HU'S PRODUCING NON-RESPONSES, OR PRE-ELECTION ONLY RESPONSES WERE CHOSEN FOR THE CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE. IN THIS CASE, ALL HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS EIGHTEEN YEARS AND OVER WERE LISTED AND AN INTERVIEW ATTEMPTED WITH ONE OBJECTIVELY SELECTED RESPONDENT (SEE LESLIE KISH, "A PROCEDURE FOR OBJECTIVE RESPONDENT SELECTION WITHIN THE HOUSEHOLD," JOURNAL OF THE AMERICAN STATISTICAL ASSOCIATION, 44 (SEPTEMBER, 1949), PP. 38-387.
3. TREATMENT OF 1976 HU'S NONEXISTENT IN 1974: INTERVIEWERS WERE INSTRUCTED TO UPDATE THE HU LISTINGS FOR EACH SAMPLE SEGMENT. TWO-THIRDS OF THE NEWLY ADDED HU'S WERE INCLUDED IN THE CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE. AT EACH OF THESE HU'S, HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE AND OVER WERE LISTED AND AN INTERVIEW ATTEMPTED WITH AN OBJECTIVELY SELECTED RESPONDENT.
4. 1974 CROSS-SECTION ONLY AT 1972 ADDRESSES: THESE ARE RESPONDENTS WHO WERE 1974 CROSS-SECTION RESPONDENTS WHO CONTINUE TO RESIDE AT HU'S SELECTED FOR THE 1976 CROSS-SECTION. ALL OF THESE RESPONDENTS WERE INCLUDED IN THE 1976 CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE IF THEY SATISFIED EITHER OF THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA, AS IN 1B, ABOVE: (A) NO NEW MEMBERS HAD BEEN ADDED TO THE HOUSEHOLD SINCE 1974; OR (B) NEW MEMBERS HAD BEEN ADDED TO THE HOUSEHOLD BUT THE RESPONDENT INTERVIEWED IN 1974 WAS OBJECTIVELY SELECTED FROM THE ELIGIBLE 1976 MEMBERS. IF THE SELECTION PROCEDURE CHOSE NEW MEMBERS, INTERVIEWS WERE TAKEN WITH A TWO-THIRDS SUBSAMPLE.

THE SAMPLE DESIGN EMPLOYED FOR THE 1976 CROSS-SECTION PRODUCES A REPRESENTATIVE SAMPLE OF UNITED STATES CITIZENS, EIGHTEEN YEARS OLD AND OLDER RESIDING WITHIN THE FORTY-EIGHT CONTIGUOUS STATES WHEN THE APPROPRIATE SAMPLE WEIGHTS (DESCRIBED BELOW) ARE APPLIED. THESE WEIGHTS ARE NECESSARY TO BRING ABOUT EQUIVALENCE BETWEEN THE TWO-THIRDS SUBSAMPLED HU'S AND THE HU'S WHERE NON-MOVING PANEL MEMBERS WERE FOUND TO RESIDE.

>> 1976 WEIGHTING INFORMATION

THE 1976 CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY SAMPLE CONSISTED OF PANEL AND CROSS-SECTION COMPONENTS. THE RECONTACTED RESPONDENTS FORMING THE PANEL WERE FIRST INTERVIEWED IN THE PRE- AND POST-ELECTION PHASES OF THE 1972 CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY, AND THEN AGAIN

IN THE 1974 CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY. OF THESE PANEL RESPONDENTS, 1,005 WERE PART OF THE 1976 CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE. THESE RESPONDENTS WERE GIVEN A SELF-WEIGHT OF 1. TO FORM A REPRESENTATIVE CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE OF ADULTS 18 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER, 1,243 NON-PANEL RESPONDENTS WERE SELECTED BY SUBSAMPLING THE 1972 SAMPLE OF HOUSING UNITS AT A TWO-THIRDS FRACTION. CONSEQUENTLY, THESE CROSS-SECTION (NON-PANEL) RESPONDENTS WERE GIVEN A WEIGHT OF 1.5.

THE UNWEIGHTED N IS 2,248, BUT APPLICATION OF THE WEIGHTS YIELDS AN N OF 2,868.5. THE WEIGHT VARIABLE (V763003) MUST BE EMPLOYED WHENEVER THESE DATA ARE USED IN ORDER TO OBTAIN A REPRESENTATIVE CROSS-SECTION OF THE VOTING POPULATION OF THE UNITED STATES IN 1976.

>> 1976 FREQUENCIES INFORMATION

THE FREQUENCIES USED IN THE CODEBOOK WERE OBTAINED BY APPLYING THE WEIGHT VARIABLE (V763003). THE FMERG PROGRAM USED TO GENERATE FREQUENCIES FOR THIS CODEBOOK ROUNDS OFF EACH CODE VALUE TO THE NEAREST INTEGER. CONSEQUENTLY, THE TOTAL N FOR MOST VARIABLES WILL RANGE BETWEEN 2,870 AND 2,872. THERE ARE A FEW INSTANCES, HOWEVER, WHERE DUE TO THE LARGE NUMBER OF CODE CATEGORIES, EACH OF WHICH IS SUBJECT TO ROUNDING, THE TOTAL N IS INCREASED CONSIDERABLY. Line 2 - VARIABLE NAME. Note that in the codebook the variable name (usually a 'number') does not include the "V" prefix which is used in the release SAS and SPSS data definition files (.sas and .sps files) for all variables including those which do not have 'number' names. For example the variable "VERSION" in the codebook is "VVERSION" in the data definition files.

Line 2 - "NAME". This is the variable label used in the SAS and SPSS data definition files (.sas and .sps files). Some codebooks exclude this.

Line 3 - COLUMNS. Columns in the ASCII data file (.dat file).

Line 4 - CHARACTER OR NUMERIC. If numeric and the variable is a decimal rather than integer variable, the number of decimal places is also indicated (e.g. "NUMERIC DEC 4")

Line 5 - Values which are assigned to missing by default in the Study's SAS and and SPSS data definition files (.sas and .sps files).

Line 7 - Actual question text for survey variables or a description of non-survey variables (for example, congressional district). Survey items usually include the question number (for example "B1a.") from the Study questionnaire; beginning in 1996 non-survey items also have unique item numbers (for example "CSheet.1").

Line 9 - A dashed or dotted line usually separates question text from any other documentation which follows.

Line 10- When present, annotation provided by Study staff is presented below the question text/description and preceding code values.

Lines 11-16

Code values are listed with descriptive labels. Valid codes (those not having 'missing' status in line 5) are presented

first, followed by the values described in line 5. For continuous variables, one line may appear providing the range of possible values. A blank line usually separates the 'valid' and 'missing' values.

Lines 11-16

Marginals are usually provided for discrete variables. The counts may be unweighted or weighted; check the Study codebook introductory text to determine weight usage.
