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□>>INTRODUCTION: PROJECT PROFILE

The NES/CPS 1998 Pilot Study for the American National Election Studies was conducted by the Center for Political Studies of the Institute for Social Research, under the general direction of Principal Investigators Gina Sapiro and Steven Rosenstone. Kathy Cirkseña was the Project Manager and Michael Horvath was the Study Manager for the 1998 Pilot Study.

Since 1978 the National Election Studies have been designed under the supervision of a National Board of Overseers. >>1998 PILOT STUDY DESCRIPTION

NES Pilot Studies have a different mission from the regular election studies. The Pilot Studies are central to the design process of the fall election studies in which interviewing minutes are a scarce resource. The pilot enables thorough testing and evaluation of the reliability and validity of proposed new items before a decision is made to include them in the fall election year studies. They provide the opportunity for new instrumentation to be tested, the measurement of core concepts to be improved, and innovations to survey methods to be tried out.

Although NES Pilot Studies are designed for research and development leading to improvement of the primary "production studies," they are nevertheless rich sources of data appropriate as bases of social science research for a variety of uses. The 1998 Pilot Study is one of the most innovative to date. This is the first time an NES Pilot Study has been run during an election season. This allowed us to test instrumentation that can only be tested in the context of an electoral campaign. Given the increasing focus within the field of electoral behavior on the impact of campaigns, the Board of Overseers authorized a survey designed explicitly to improve NES's capacity to help illuminate the impact of campaigns. The planning Committee chose three high-profile gubernatorial contests to investigate: California, Illinois, and Georgia.

>>1998 PILOT STUDY ADMINISTRATION

The 1998 Pilot Study was a 40 minute pre-election, telephone survey. Telephone interviews with California, Illinois, and Georgia households were selected by random digit dialing. A random digit dialing sample in each state was purchased from Genesys Sampling Systems of Fort Washington, PA. The sample population was described as all U.S. citizens (over age 18 by the day of the election), residing and eligible to vote in California, Illinois and Georgia. This definition excludes people who do not live in telephone households. In an attempt to randomize age and gender of respondents, individuals were selected using the Kish method, identifying the number, gender, and age of all household members.

The full study commenced on September 8, 1998 and was completed on November 3, 1999. Several procedures were followed to achieve a high response rate for the survey. All cases received up to 14 call attempts. These call attempts alternated day of the week and time of the day. Refusal prevention strategies were used throughout the interview process. In addition, identified respondents were offered a \$10 check as a thank you gift for completing the survey.

Final result codes for the total sample were used to calculate two kinds of response rates as presented in the table below. The summary response rate (the ratio of completed interviews to the total number of potential respondents) for the study was 41.5%. The completion rate (the ratio of cases in which some responsible member of the housing unit was reached to the total number of potential respondents) for the study was 99.4%.

>>1998 PILOT STUDY CONTENT

Among the concepts measured in the 1998 Pilot Study are: campaign and political interest; political knowledge; media use; social context and communication; political issue attitudes and awareness keyed to the actual campaigns; political mobilization, including group-based mobilization; campaign participation; candidate awareness, placements, and affect; campaign tone; political ideology, efficacy, and trust; partisanship; public mood; need for evaluation; the vote decision; and certainty.

Several measures were piloted for the first time in the 1998 Pilot. Among these are: measures that indicate what part of the day R tends to watch television; social context and communication variables; need for evaluation; group mobilization; public mood; a new affirmative action measure; perceived tone of the campaign; awareness of campaign issues; whether R owns stock.

A significant portion of the interview was devoted to methodological investigation of concepts previously measured in NES surveys. Among these are: campaign participation; media use; feeling thermometers as measures of awareness; vote intention; political knowledge.
