THE FOLLOWING EXPLANATION OF THE FEELING THERMOMETER WAS INCLUDED IN THE QUESTIONNAIRE AND READ BY THE INTERVIEWER TO THE RESPONDENT:

I HAVE HERE A CARD ON WHICH THERE IS SOMETHING THAT LOOKS LIKE A THERMOMETER. WE CALL IT A FEELING THERMOMETER BECAUSE IT MEASURES YOUR FEELINGS TOWARDS THESE PEOPLE. HERE'S HOW IT WORKS. IF YOU DON'T FEEL PARTICULARLY WARM OR COLD TOWARD A PERSON, THEN YOU SHOULD PLACE HIM IN THE MID-

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DLE OF THE THERMOMETER, AT THE FIFTY DEGREE MARK. IF YOU HAVE A WARM FEELING TOWARD A PERSON, OR FEEL FAVORABLY TOWARD HIM, YOU WOULD GIVE HIM A SCORE SOMEWHERE BETWEEN FIFTY AND ONE HUNDRED DEGREES, DEPENDING ON HOW WARM YOUR FEELING IS TOWARD THAT PERSON. ON THE OTHER HAND, IF YOU DON'T FEEL VERY FAVORABLY TOWARD A PERSON--THAT IS, IF YOU DON'T CARE TOO MUCH FOR HIM--THEN YOU WOULD PLACE HIM SOMEWHERE BETWEEN ZERO AND FIFTY DEGREES. OF COURSE IF YOU DON'T KNOW TOO MUCH ABOUT A PERSON JUST TELL ME AND WE'LL GO ON TO THE NEXT NAME.

THE INTERVIEWER WAS INSTRUCTED TO TAKE SOME TIME TO EXPLAIN HOW THE THERMOMETER WORKS, AND TO SHOW THE RESPONDENT HOW TO LOCATE AN INDIVIDUAL WITH DEGREE LABELS.

IF THE RESPONDENT GAVE A RANGE, THE MIDPOINT WAS CODED ROUNDING TO THE NEAREST ODD NUMBER IF NECESSARY.
