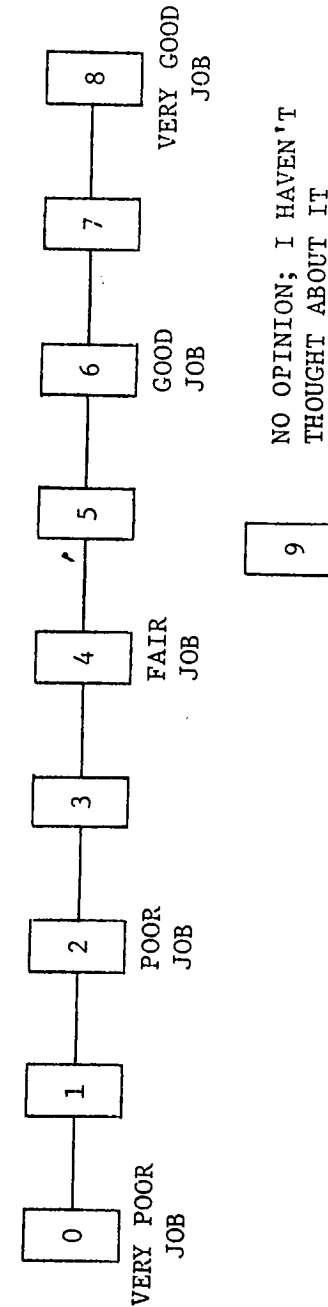

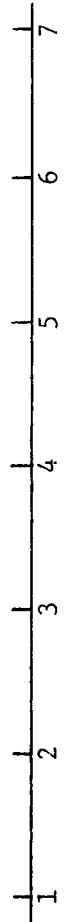

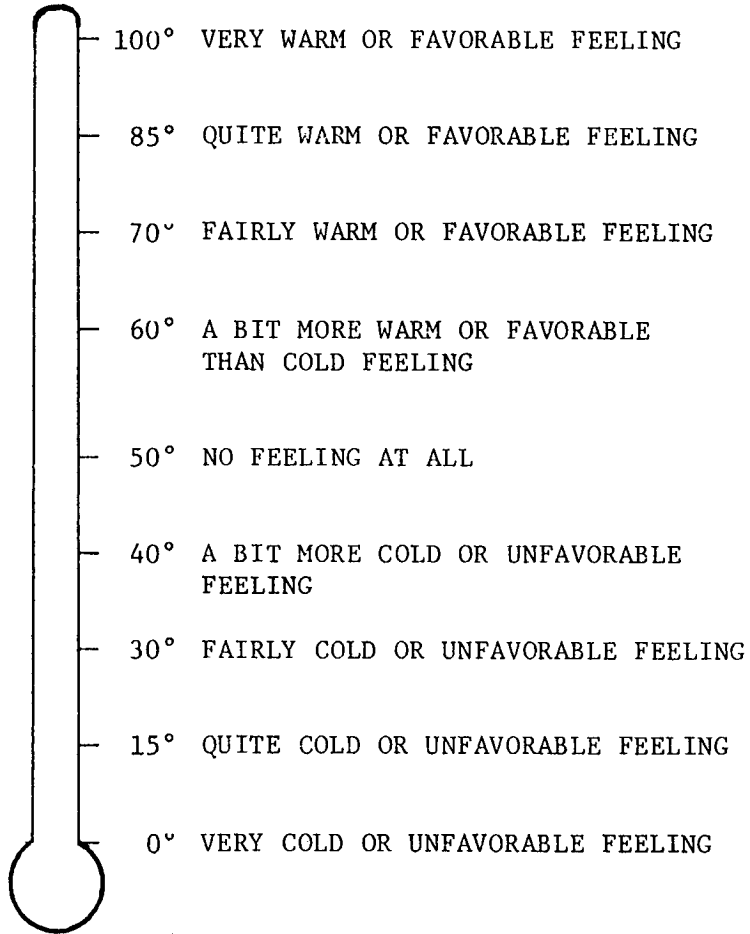
WOMEN AND MEN SHOULD

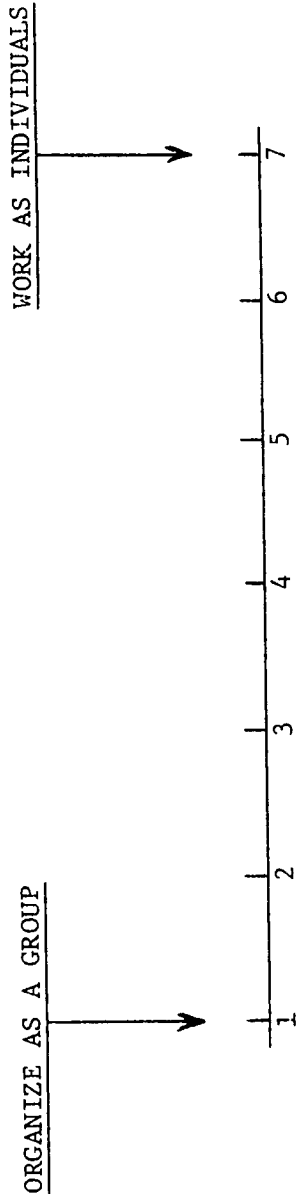
