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□>> 1980 STUDY DESCRIPTION

THE NES/CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY, 1980, WAS CONDUCTED BY THE CENTER FOR POLITICAL STUDIES OF THE INSTITUTE FOR SOCIAL RESEARCH, THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN, UNDER THE OVERALL DIRECTION OF WARREN E. MILLER. MARIA ELENA SANCHEZ WAS DIRECTOR OF STUDIES IN 1980. THIS IS THE SIXTEENTH IN A SERIES OF STUDIES OF AMERICAN NATIONAL

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ELECTIONS PRODUCED BY THE POLITICAL BEHAVIOR PROGRAM OF THE SURVEY RESEARCH CENTER AND THE CENTER FOR POLITICAL STUDIES, AND THE SECOND STUDY TO BE CONDUCTED UNDER THE AUSPICES OF A NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION GRANT (NO. SOC77-08885) WHICH PROVIDES LONG-TERM SUPPORT FOR NATIONAL ELECTION STUDIES.

THE 1980 ELECTION STUDY WAS AN AMBITIOUS PROJECT CONSISTING OF EIGHT INTEGRATED SURVEY DATA COLLECTIONS SCHEDULED TO OCCUR AT STRATEGICALLY CHOSEN PERIODS IN THE COURSE OF THE CALENDER YEAR. THE INTRODUCTORY SECTION "DESIGN OF THE NES/CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY, 1980" PROVIDES DETAILS ABOUT THE OVERALL STUDY DESIGN. THE FORMULATION OF THE DESIGN STARTED IN SUMMER, 1978, WITH A WORKSHOP THAT BROUGHT TOGETHER THE CPS PROJECT STAFF, MEMBERS OF THE NES BOARD OF OVERSEERS, AND A GROUP OF SCHOLARS REPRESENTING BOARD INTERESTS. THE GROUP OF SCHOLARS INVITED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE 1978 WORKSHOP WERE: JOHN H. ALDRICH, RICHARD A. BRODY, STEVEN H. CHAFFEE, JACK DENNIS, LUTZ ERBRING, JOHN H. KESSEL, DONALD R. KINDER, RICHARD G. NIEMI, AND HERBERT F. WEISBERG. PHILIP E. CONVERSE, M. KENT JENNINGS AND ARTHUR H. MILLER FROM THE CENTER FOR POLITICAL STUDIES ALSO ATTENDED THE MEETINGS. A STIMULUS MEMORANDUM ON THE 1980 DESIGN OPTIONS WAS MAILED TO THE SCHOLARLY COMMUNITY IN THE AFTERMATH OF THE WORKSHOP TO ELICIT FURTHER IDEAS ON DESIGN AND CONTENT. IN THE MONTHS THAT FOLLOWED, THE STUDY DESIGN WAS FURTHER SPECIFIED AND REVISED TO ACHIEVE ITS PRESENT FORM.

AS PART OF RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT EFFORTS SPONSORED BY THE NES BOARD, SEVERAL CONFERENCES AND WORKSHOPS WERE HELD IN 1977-1979 TO EXPLORE INNOVATION IN CONTENT AND MEASUREMENT FOR THE 1980 STUDY. BOARD MEMBERS DURING THE 1980 PLANNING PHASE INCLUDE: HEINZ EULAU, STANFORD UNIVERSITY; RICHARD F. FENNO, JR., UNIVERSITY OF ROCHESTER; JOHN E. JACKSON, UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA; DAVID R. MAYHEW, YALE UNIVERSITY; WARREN E. MILLER, UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN, EX-OFFICIO; BENJAMIN I. PAGE, UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO; MILDRED A. SCHWARTZ, UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS, CHICAGO CIRCLE; DAVID O. SEARS, UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, LOS ANGELES; J. MERRILL SHANKS, UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, BERKELEY; AND JOHN SPRAGUE, WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY.

FOUR AREAS WERE TARGETED FOR SPECIAL ATTENTION: NEW MEASUREMENT OF PARTY IDENTIFICATION, THE MEASUREMENT OF VOTER ATTITUDES CONCERNING ISSUES OF PUBLIC POLICY, NEW CONTENT CONCERNING PUBLIC PERCEPTIONS OF AND RESPONSES TO POLITICAL LEADERSHIP, AND THE EXPLORATION OF SOCIAL NETWORKS IN THE CRYSTALLIZATION OF VOTE CHOICE. SUBSTANTIVE CONSIDERATIONS FROM THE VARIOUS CONFERENCES AND WORKSHOPS, AS WELL AS SUGGESTIONS MADE BY SCHOLARS WHO SUBMITTED MEMORANDA IN CONNECTION WITH THESE MEETINGS, CULMINATED IN THE PLANNING AND EXECUTION OF NATIONAL PILOT STUDY IN SPRING, 1979. RESULTS FROM THE PILOT STUDY HAVE INFORMED SUBSTANTIVE DECISIONS AND INNOVATIONS IN THE 1980 STUDY CONTENTS. THE MAJOR CONTRIBUTORS TO THE PILOT STUDY WERE: ROBERT P. ABELSON, JOHN H. ALDRICH, RICHARD A. BRODY, STEVEN H. CHAFFEE, PETER CLARKE, JACK DENNIS, LUTZ ERBRING, HEINZ EULAU, SUSAN FISKE, JOHN E. JACKSON, RICHARD S. KATZ,

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DONALD R. KINDER, ARTHUR H. MILLER, RICHARD G. NIEMI, DAVID W. ROHDE, DAVID O. SEARS, J. MERRILL SHANKS, HERBERT F. WEISBERG, AND RICHARD R. LAU.

THE NES BOARD ESTABLISHED A 1980 PRESIDENTIAL ELECTIONS COMMITTEE CONSISTING OF THREE BOARD MEMBERS (MERRILL SHANKS, CHAIRMAN; JOHN JACKSON, DAVID SEARS) AND THREE SCHOLARS WHO PARTICIPATED IN THE R & D WORK (RICHARD A. BRODY, JACK DENNIS, DONALD R. KINDER). THIS COMMITTEE, ALONG WITH THE CPS PROJECT STAFF, WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE PLANNING OF THE YEAR-LONG STUDY.

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>> 1980 - DESIGN OF THE NES/CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY

EVOLUTION OF THE NES/CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY, 1980 DESIGN RESULTED IN THE SPECIFICATION OF EIGHT DISCRETE DATA COLLECTIONS. ALL INTERVIEWS WERE TAKEN WITH SAMPLES OF CITIZENS OF VOTING AGE AS OF NOVEMBER 4, 1980, LIVING WITHIN THE COTERMINOUS UNITED STATES. AS IN 1978, CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS CONSTITUTE THE SAMPLING PRIMARY AREAS, AND THE WASHINGTON, D.C. AREA IS NOT REPRESENTED IN THE NATIONAL SAMPLE. ALL OF THE EIGHT DATA COLLECTIONS ARE AVAILABLE IN ONE LARGE FILE, REFERRED TO AS THE INTEGRATED FILE.

FOUR OF THE DATA COLLECTIONS INVOLVE A YEAR-LONG PANEL, WHICH HAS BEEN RELEASED SEPARATELY BY THE CONSORTIUM AS THE MAJOR PANEL FILE.

A FIFTH COMPONENT OF THE DESIGN CONSISTED OF AN INDEPENDENT CROSS-SECTION SAMPLE OF 965 CASES (DESIGNATED IN MOST DESCRIPTIONS OF THE 1980 COLLECTION AS C-1) INTERVIEWED IN THE MIDST OF THE PRIMARY SEASON DURING THE THREE-WEEK "WINDOW" FOLLOWING THE EARLY APRIL PRIMARIES. THEY WERE REINTERVIEWED FOLLOWING THE ELECTION WITH A TELEPHONE INTERVIEW. 818 CASES MAKE UP THIS REINTERVIEW (C-4), THE SIXTH COMPONENT OF THE STUDY. C-1 AND C-4 ARE AVAILABLE ONLY AS PART OF THE INTEGRATED FILE, AND ARE NOT RELEASED SEPARATELY (ALTHOUGH ARRANGEMENTS MAY BE MADE WITH CONSORTIUM MEMBER SERVICES TO SUBSET THE INTEGRATED FILE IF JUST THESE COLLECTIONS ARE DESIRED).

THE SEVENTH AND EIGHTH COMPONENTS ARE THE TRADITIONAL PRE-POST ELECTION TIME SERIES SURVEYS, DOCUMENTED IN THIS CODEBOOK. THE PRE-ELECTION INTERVIEW (C-3) WAS TAKEN WITH WAS TAKEN WITH 1614 CASES (APPROXIMATELY 15 PER CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT. THE EIGHTH COMPONENT (C3PO) CONSISTS OF 1408 POST-ELECTION REINTERVIEWS WITH THE PRE-ELECTION SAMPLE. THE REINTERVIEW RATE IS 87 PERCENT.

THE LAST DATA COLLECTION TOOK PLACE IN JANUARY-FEBRUARY, 1981, WHEN THE VOTE VALIDATION STUDY WAS CONDUCTED.

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INTERVIEWERS WENT TO ELECTORAL OFFICES THROUGHOUT THE NATION TO ESTABLISH WHETHER THE RESPONDENTS WERE REGISTERED IN 1980 AND, IF REGISTERED, WHETHER THEY HAD VISITED THE POLLS TO VOTE ON ELECTION DAY. 1980 ELECTION RESULTS WERE ALSO COLLECTED AT THIS TIME FOR THE PRECINCTS REPRESENTED IN THE SAMPLE, AS WELL AS SAMPLE BALLOTS FOR THE DISTRICTS AND A COPY OF ELECTORAL ELIGIBILITY RULES. THESE DATA ARE INCLUDED IN ALL THREE OF THE CONSORTIUM RELEASES DISCUSSED ABOVE; THE INTEGRATED FILE, THE MAJOR PANEL FILE AND THE PRE-AND POST ELECTION SURVEYS FILE.

THE SAMPLE SELECTIONS FOR THE MAJOR PANEL FILE WERE INITIALLY DIVIDED INTO FIRST-HALF AND SECOND-HALF SAMPLE. THIS SAMPLE DIFFERENTIATION WAS IGNORED WHEN P-1 AND P-2 WENT INTO THE FIELD IN FAVOR OF MAXIMIZING THE EFFICIENCY OF THESE DATA COLLECTIONS. HOWEVER, THE THIRD PANEL INTERVIEW (P-3) WAS ADMINISTERED AS TWO RANDOM HALVES; THE FIRST HALF WAS INTERVIEWED IN EARLY SEPTEMBER, THE SECOND IN LATE SEPTEMBER.

THE TRADITIONAL PRE ELECTION INTERVIEW (C-3) WAS ALSO SEGMENTED, WITH INTERVIEWS IN EARLY SEPTEMBER (WITH THE FIRST HALF OF P-3), LATE SEPTEMBER (WITH THE SECOND HALF OF P-3), IN THE FIRST PART OF OCTOBER, AND IN LATE OCTOBER. THIS SEGMENTATION OF THE C-3 SAMPLE PERMITS THE COMPLETE OVERLAP OF P-3 WITH THE NEW CROSS-SECTIONS IN SEPTEMBER, PERMITTING AN ASSESSMENT OF CONTAMINATION INTRODUCED INTO THE PANEL AS A RESULT OF PRIOR INTERVIEWS. ASSUMING ALSO MINIMAL BIAS AS A RESULT OF PANEL MORTALITY, IT PERMITS THE PYRAMIDING OF P-3 AND THE FIRST TWO COMPONENTS OF C-3 TO FORM A LARGER SEPTEMBER SAMPLE.

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>> 1980 SAMPLING INFORMATION

THE STUDY EMPLOYS A SAMPLING FRAME OF CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT PREVIOUSLY USED TO OBTAIN THE SAMPLE FOR THE NES/CPS AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY, 1978. THESE 108 CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS COMPRISE THE PRIMARY SAMPLING AREAS. THEY WERE SELECTED IN THE FIRST STAGE OF THE MULTI-AREA PROBABILITY SAMPLE DEVELOPED IN 1978. AT THAT TIME, THE UNIVERSE OF 432 ELIGIBLE CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS WAS DIVIDED INTO 108 STRATA, EACH CONTAINING FOUR CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS OF ROUGHLY COMPARABLE CHARACTERISTICS THAT INCLUDED, INsofar AS POSSIBLE, HOMOGENEITY WITH RESPECT TO GEOGRAPHIC REGION, STATE, URBANIZATION AND RECENT VOTING BEHAVIOR. THESE STRATA ARE NUMBERED 1 THROUGH 108 IN VARIABLE 827. FROM EACH OF THE 108 STRATA, ONE DISTRICT WAS THEN SELECTED WITH PROBABILITY OF SELECTION IN PROPORTION TO THE 1975 ESTIMATED POPULATION TO YIELD THE 108 CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS IN THE SAMPLING FRAME.

IN THE NEXT STAGES OF SELECTION, SAMPLE AREAS WERE OBTAINED WITHIN EACH OF THE SAMPLE DISTRICTS. WHEN THE CONGRESSIONAL

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DISTRICT WAS PART OF A MAJOR CITY, A SAMPLE OF BLOCKS WAS DISTRIBUTED THROUGHOUT THE DISTRICT. IN THE CASE OF DISTRICTS THAT COMPRISED SEVERAL COUNTIES, GENERALLY, ONE OR TWO COUNTIES WERE SELECTED, AND, WITHIN THE SAMPLE COUNTIES, ABOUT 10 OR 12 CITY OR TOWN BLOCKS AND SEGMENTS OF RURAL AREAS WERE DRAWN. A SELECTION OF HOUSING UNITS FOR THE CURRENT STUDY WAS MADE FROM LISTS OF HOUSING UNITS WITHIN SUCH SAMPLE BLOCKS AND SEGMENTS.

AT THE OVERALL RATE OF 1:11,200, A SAMPLE OF APPROXIMATELY 7,500 HOUSING UNITS WAS DRAWN FOR USE THROUGHOUT THE YEAR-LONG MONITORING CYCLE. THESE ARE THE DWELLINGS WHERE INTERVIEWERS CALLED AT DESIGNATED TIMES TO ATTEMPT INTERVIEWS WITH ONE OBJECTIVELY SELECTED ELIGIBLE PERSON. THE SAMPLE WAS DESIGNED TO BE REPRESENTATIVE OF REGIONS, AS DEFINED BY THE FOUR-FOLD CENSUS BUREAU REGION CLASSIFICATION.

THE C-3 SAMPLE SELECTIONS WERE SCIENTIFICALLY DIVIDED INTO FOUR NATIONAL SUBSETS ADMINISTERED DURING SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER IN CONSECUTIVE TWO-WEEK INTERVIEWING PERIODS. MOST OF THE INTERVIEWS WERE COMPLETED DURING THE TARGETED TIME FRAME. LATE INTERVIEWS FOR ANY GIVEN ADMINISTRATION PERIOD WERE GENERALLY COMPLETED IN THE WEEK IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE TARGETED PERIOD, THE SO-CALLED "GRACE PERIOD." SOME

INTERVIEWS, HOWEVER, WERE COMPLETED LATER THAN THIS FOR A VARIETY OF REASONS, INVOLVING AMONG OTHER THINGS, THE RESPONDENT'S UNAVAILABILITY AT THE APPROPRIATE TIME. SEE REFNO 48 FOR A DETAILED BREAKDOWN.

LATE INTERVIEWS FOR TWO PRIMARY AREAS (CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS TX03 AND CA29) REPRESENT UNUSUAL AND UNFORTUNATE CIRCUMSTANCES. MID-WAY THROUGH THE C3PO POST-ELECTION SURVEY, THE FIELD OFFICE VERIFIED THAT ALL C3 PRE-ELECTION INTERVIEWS IN THESE TWO AREAS HAD BEEN FABRICATED BY THE AREA INTERVIEWER. TO RECOVER SOME OF THE MISSED PRE-ELECTION INFORMATION, INCLUDING DEMOGRAPHIC DATA, A SHORTENED PRE-ELECTION INTERVIEW WAS CONDUCTED WITH THE LEGITIMATE RESPONDENTS AT THE TIME THEY WERE CONTACTED FOR THE POST-ELECTION ADMINISTRATION.

THE NUMBER OF C3 SAMPLE SELECTIONS IN TX03 WAS MUCH LARGER THAN CA29; FIELD WORK IN THE TEXAS DISTRICT COULD NOT HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED UNLESS THE INTERVIEWING LOAD WAS REDUCED. ACCORDINGLY, A RANDOM HALF-SAMPLE WAS DRAWN FROM THE ORIGINAL TX03 SAMPLE SELECTIONS FOR C3 AND ONLY THESE RESPONDENTS WERE CONTACTED AS POST-ELECTION TIME. WEIGHTING TO COMPENSATE FOR THIS SUBSAMPLING DONE IN TX03 WAS HANDLED BY DUPLICATING THE DATA RECORDS OF THE RESPONDENTS IN THE TARGETED HALF-SAMPLE. THIS PROCEDURE MADE IT UNNECESSARY TO RESORT TO A WEIGHT VARIABLE FOR CORRECTIONS PURPOSES.

THE PRE-ELECTION CASE ID'S OF THE RESPONDENTS IN TX03 AND CA29 AND THE CASE ID'S FOR THE DUPLICATED TX03 RECORDS IN THE C3 SAMPLE ARE AS FOLLOWS:

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>> 1980 CONTENTS OF THE PRE-POST ELECTION FILE

AS WITH OTHER PARTS OF THE AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY, 1980, THE PRE-AND POST ELECTION SURVEYS FILE HAS A VERY HEAVY EMPHASIS ON CANDIDATE EVALUATION AND VOTE CHOICE. RESPONDENTS ARE ASKED HOW CANDIDATES MAKE THEM FEEL, WHAT WORDS DESCRIBE CANDIDATES, HOW CANDIDATES RATE ON THE FEELING THERMOMETER, WHAT THEY LIKE AND DISLIKE ABOUT EACH AND REASONS FOR VOTING FOR OR AGAINST EACH MAJOR PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATE.

IN ADDITION TO NOW-STANDARD QUESTIONS ON PARTY IDENTIFICATION, RESPONDENTS ARE PROBED EXTENSIVELY ABOUT WHAT THEY MEAN WHEN THEY SAY THEY ARE REPUBLICANS, DEMOCRATS OR INDEPENDENTS. RESPONDENTS ARE ALSO ASKED ABOUT THEIR ATTENTION TO MEDIA, POLITICAL ACTIVISM, CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS, AND WHETHER THEY WERE CONTACTED IN ANY WAY BY THE HOUSE, SENATE, GUBERNATORIAL OR PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION CAMPAIGNS.

THIS FILE INCLUDES A FULL RANGE OF OCCUPATION AND EDUCATION MEASURES. USERS SHOULD READ THE VARIABLE DESCRIPTION LIST SECTION RELATING TO THESE MEASURES WITH CARE, AND SHOULD ALSO REFER TO NOTE 13. THIS SECTION DIFFERS IN ORGANIZATION FROM PREVIOUS NATIONAL ELECTION STUDIES, AND FROM THE WAY THESE VARIABLES WERE ORGANIZED IN THE PREVIOUS CONSORTIUM RELEASE.

INDIVIDUAL VOTER RECORD VALIDATION DATA (VARIABLES 801197-841208) REPORTS THE EFFORT TO VALIDATE THE RESPONSES ABOUT REGISTRATION AND VOTING BEHAVIOR. PERSONAL VISITS WERE MADE BY MEMBERS OF THE SRC FIELD STAFF DURING JANUARY AND FEBRUARY 1981 TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT OFFICES CHARGED WITH THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR MAINTAINING REGISTRATION AND VOTING RECORDS IN THE 108 SAMPLE DISTRICTS. TELEPHONE CALLS WERE MADE BY CPS STAFF TO THOSE PLACES OUTSIDE THE STUDY SAMPLE WHEN A RESPONDENT CLAIMED TO BE REGISTERED IN SUCH AN AREA.

INCLUDED ALSO IN THIS RELEASE OF THE PRE-AND POST ELECTION SURVEYS ARE A SET OF CONTEXTUAL DATA WHICH WERE COLLECTED FROM VARIOUS SOURCES AND THEN ADDED TO EACH RESPONDENT'S TO

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RECORD. THESE CONTEXTUAL DATA VARIABLES INCLUDE ELECTION RETURNS FOR THE YEARS 1972-1980, INTEREST GROUP RATINGS OF INCUMBENTS AND FEDERAL ELECTION COMMISSION DATA ON CAMPAIGN EXPENDITURE. THE CONTEXTUAL DATA IS DOCUMENTED IN THE APPENDICES.

FROM THE SAME STATE, IN THE CASE OF STATE LEVEL DATA, OR CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT, IN THE CASE OF DISTRICT LEVEL DATA.

THAT IS, THE TYPE OF RACE WOULD BE CODED 13, 19, 23, 29, 56-59, 66-69, OR 76-79 IN Q.AA5, Q.AA6, AND/OR Q.AA8. THESE INDEPENDENT/MINOR PARTY CANDIDATES WERE REFERENCED IN THE FEELING THERMOMETERS IN Q.G50 AND Q.G5V.

SPECIAL INFORMATION: NEW YORK STATE

IN THE RACE FOR SENATE IN NEW YORK, JACOB JAVITS, THE REPUBLICAN INCUMBENT, LOST THE REPUBLICAN PRIMARY BUT RECEIVED THE NOMINATION OF THE LIBERAL PARTY AND RAN UNDER THIS PARTY BANNER. THE NEW YORK STATE SENATE RACE IS CODED AS "69" IN Q.AA6 (REF. NO 629) - "REPUBLICAN INCUMBENT NOT RUNNING WITH DEMOCRATIC, REPUBLICAN AND OTHER CANDIDATES". THROUGHOUT THE QUESTIONNAIRE, JAVITS IS REFERENCED AS AN INDEPENDENT/ MINOR PARTY CANDIDATE.

LIBERAL, CONSERVATIVE, AND INDEPENDENT CANDIDATES RUNNING IN NEW YORK HAVE BEEN INCLUDED IN THE CANDIDATE LIST FOR SEVEN CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS: 03, 13, 19, 22, 26, 27, AND 30. IN CASES WHERE THE DEMOCRATIC OR REPUBLICAN CANDIDATES ALSO HAVE THE SUPPORT OF THE LIBERAL OR CONSERVATIVE PARTIES, THEY ARE CONSIDERED THE DEMOCRATIC OR REPUBLICAN CANDIDATE. WHERE THE INCLUSION OF THESE CANDIDATES RESULTED IN A THREE-WAY RACE, THE CONSERVATIVE, LIBERAL OR INDEPENDENT CANDIDATE WAS REFERRED TO IN Q.G5V.

SPECIAL INFORMATION: MAINE

IN MAINE, Q.G5S ("THE OTHER SENATE INCUMBENT WHOSE TERM

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IS NOT UP") REFERS TO EDMUND MUSKIE, DESPITE THE FACT THAT HE HAD LEFT OFFICE THE PRECEDING MAY TO BECOME SECRETARY OF STATE. THIS DECISION WAS MADE BECAUSE IT WAS FELT THAT MUSKIE WAS THE "ELECTED" SENATOR AND HAD HELD THE OFFICE FOR A LONGER PERIOD OF TIME.

SPECIAL INFORMATION: WEST VIRGINIA

IN WEST VIRGINIA CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT 3, THE LATE JOHN M. SLACK WAS TREATED AS THE INCUMBENT REPRESENTATIVE EVEN THOUGH HE DIED IN MARCH 1980. IN JUNE OF 1980, JOHN G. HUTCHINSON WAS ELECTED TO SUCCEED SLACK AND RAN FOR RE-ELECTION IN NOVEMBER, 1980. SINCE SLACK HAD BEEN THE INCUMBENT FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS, IT WAS DECIDED THAT QUESTIONS ABOUT THE INCUMBENT WOULD REFER TO SLACK AND QUESTIONS CONCERNING THE DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATE WOULD REFER TO HUTCHINSON.

SPECIAL INFORMATION: LOUISIANA

ACCORDING TO LOUISIANA ELECTION LAWS, ANY CANDIDATE RECEIVING OVER FIFTY PERCENT OF THE PRIMARY VOTE IS ELECTED TO OFFICE AND DOES NOT APPEAR ON THE BALLOT IN THE NOVEMBER GENERAL ELECTION. IN BOTH CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS, LA03 AND LA07, THE CONGRESSIONAL CANDIDATES WERE SO ELECTED. THESE RACES WERE CODED 14 IN Q.AA5 (REF. NO. 740), IDENTIFYING THEM AS DISTRICTS WITH CONGRESSIONAL INCUMBENTS RUNNING UNOPPOSED. THE LOUISIANA RACE FOR U.S. SENATE WAS DETERMINED IN THE SAME MANNER AND WAS CODED 14 IN Q.AA6 (REF. NO. 741). THE TWO CONGRESSIONAL CANDIDATES AND THE SENATE CANDIDATE ARE ALL REFERRED TO AS "DEMOCRATIC INCUMBENTS RUNNING UNOPPOSED".

THE VOTE SECTION (Q.L4-Q.L8B AND Q.L17-Q.L21B) WAS OMITTED FOR THESE DISTRICTS. RESPONDENTS WERE ASKED Q.L1 AND Q.L2 SINCE THEY DID HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO VOTE ON OTHER MATTERS IN NOVEMBER.

SPECIAL INFORMATION: UNOPPOSED CONGRESSIONAL RACES

QUESTION WORDING IN IN Q.H5, Q.H7, Q.H9, Q.H9A, Q.H10B, Q.H10C AND Q.J10-Q.J10A WAS ALTERED SOMEWHAT FOR LOUISIANA DISTRICTS AND ALL OTHER DISTRICTS WITH UNOPPOSED RACES. CONGRESSIONAL CANDIDATES WERE UNOPPOSED IN THE FOLLOWING DISTRICTS: AL05, AR01, GA01, KY01, LA03, LA07, MA07, MA11, MI07, MS03, NC01, PA02, PA09, TX17, VA05.

WHEN PUBLICATION OF THE AMERICAN NATIONAL ELECTION STUDY, 1980 IS COMPLETE, THERE WILL BE FOUR PRINTED VOLUMES. VOLUME I DOCUMENTS THE PRE AND POST ELECTION SURVEYS. VOLUME II DOCUMENTS THE FOUR COMPONENTS OF THE

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MAJOR PANEL FILE. THE THIRD VOLUME, APPENDIX A, DOCUMENTS THE CONTEXTUAL DATA, AS IT APPEARS IN BOTH THE PRE-AND POST SURVEY FILE AND THE MAJOR PANEL FILE. A FOURTH VOLUME, APPENDIX B, INCLUDES NOTES AND QUESTIONNAIRES FOR BOTH FILES.

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Line 2 - VARIABLE NAME. Note that in the codebook the variable name (usually a 'number') does not include the "V" prefix which is used in the release SAS and SPSS data definition files (.sas and .sps files) for all variables including those which do not have 'number' names. For example the variable "VERSION" in the codebook is "VVERSION" in the data definition files.

Line 2 - "NAME". This is the variable label used in the SAS and SPSS data definition files (.sas and .sps files). Some codebooks exclude this.

Line 3 - COLUMNS. Columns in the ASCII data file (.dat file).

Line 4 - CHARACTER OR NUMERIC. If numeric and the variable is a decimal rather than integer variable, the number of decimal places is also indicated (e.g. "NUMERIC DEC 4")

Line 5 - Values which are assigned to missing by default in the Study's SAS and and SPSS data definition files (.sas and .sps files).

Line 7 - Actual question text for survey variables or a description of non-survey variables (for example, congressional district). Survey items usually include the question number (for example "Bla.") from the Study questionnaire; beginning in 1996 non-survey items also have unique item numbers (for example "CSheet.1").

Line 9 - A dashed or dotted line usually separates question text from any other documentation which follows.

Line 10- When present, annotation provided by Study staff is presented below the question text/description and preceding code values.

Lines 11-16
Code values are listed with descriptive labels. Valid codes (those not having 'missing' status in line 5) are presented first, followed by the values described in line 5. For continuous variables, one line may appear providing the range of possible values. A blank line usually separates the 'valid' and 'missing' values.

Lines 11-16
Marginals are usually provided for discrete variables. The counts may be unweighted or weighted; check the Study codebook introductory text to determine weight usage.
