A7. Do you approve or disapprove of the way Ronald Reagan is handling his job as President?











About the 1982 Study -

Interviewing for the in-person post-election survey began on November 3, 1982. Interviews are being taken with a national sample of approximately 1500 U. S. citizens of voting age located in the 74 primary areas of the county-based Survey Research Center National Sample. The sample geographic areas are scattered over some 170 congressional districts. In 1982, because of redistricting, it was impossible to consider drawing a new sample with new congressional districts as primary sampling areas.

The CATI study will consist of interviews approximately 50 minutes in length with a sample of 1000 respondents selected by a random digit dialed procedure. The SRC Telephone Interviewing Facility in Ann Arbor will conduct 500 of these interviews and the Computer-Assisted Survey Methods Program (CSM) at the University of California, Berkeley, the other 500. Matched half-samples are in use at each installation. Interview schedules are identical except for planned experimentation relating to measurement of issue positions. Both a "branching" format and the 7-point scales are used.

Another experimental aspect of the CATI study involves the "dynamic" assignment of respondents to congressional districts based on answers provided by them in the course of the interview.

Telephone exchanges and congressional districts have different boundaries. About half of the telephone clusters (sample areas) are wholly contained inside a single congressional district; the other half of the clusters cover areas in which two or three congressional districts are represented. After the data have been gathered, geographic information given by the respondent will be used to assess the accuracy of the CATI technique for congressional district identification.

The 1982 Study is supported by a grant from the National Science Foundation.



Where would you place yourself on this scale or haven't you thought much about this?





#### GOVERNMENT SERVICES/GOVERNMENT SPENDING




