ANES 2006 Pilot Report: Abortion Items

The ANES currently measures abortion attitudes with a single four-choice item:

There has been some discussion about abortion during recent years. I am going to read you a short list of opinions. Please tell me which one of the opinions best agrees with your view? You can just tell me the number of the opinion you choose.

- One. By law, abortion should never be permitted.
- Two. The law should permit abortion only in cases of rape, incest, or when the woman's life is in danger.
- Three. The law should permit abortion for reasons other than rape, incest, or danger to the woman's life, but only after the need for the abortion has been clearly established.
- Four. By law, a woman should always be able to obtain an abortion as a matter of personal choice.

Results from the ANES 2006 Pilot study, presented graphically in Figure 1, are consistent with other surveys: roughly ten percent of respondents oppose legal abortion for any reason, a little less than half oppose any restrictions, and the remainder prefers limited regulation.¹




¹ Exact figures for the 223 responses to the 2006 ANES pilot are 22 (9.9 percent) never permitted, 74 (33.2 percent) permitted only for rape, incest, life of the mother, 33 (14.8 percent) permitted for reasons in addition to rape, incest, and life of the mother, and 94 (42.2 percent) no restrictions.

The 2006 ANES Pilot Survey expanded the four-option item to include more distinct reasons for legal abortion, a more precise measurement of attitudes for each reason, and attitudes about timing. The pilot included seven reasons for legal abortion, each one structured as follows:



The remaining six items were:

at any time during the pregnancy.

- [First / Next], do you favor, oppose, or neither favor nor oppose abortion being LEGAL if staying pregnant would hurt the woman's health but is very unlikely to cause her to die?
- [First / Next], do you favor, oppose, or neither favor nor oppose abortion being LEGAL if the pregnancy was caused by sex the woman chose to have with a blood relative?
- [First / Next], do you favor, oppose, or neither favor nor oppose abortion being LEGAL if the pregnancy was caused by the woman being raped?
- [First / Next], do you favor, oppose, or neither favor nor oppose abortion being LEGAL if the fetus will be born with a serious birth defect?

- [First / Next], do you favor, oppose, or neither favor nor oppose abortion being LEGAL if the child will not be the sex the woman wants it to be?
- [First / Next], do you favor, oppose, or neither favor nor oppose abortion being LEGAL if having the child would be extremely difficult for the woman financially?

Two-thirds of respondents were randomly selected into either the current ANES item, and the remainder was selected into the pilot item bank. The pilot respondents were randomly selected into each of the seven abortion scenarios with regard the order in which the scenarios were presented, the number of scenarios presented, and the particular scenarios presented, with the randomization rule to assign an independent half of pilot respondents to each scenario.

We find it particularly interesting that prolife attitudes tend to be correlated, if only slightly, with belief that men are more likely to be pro-choice. It suggests that such attitudes are tied up in perceptions of the sexes, which is an avenue for research that should be pursued, because it
